



THOMAS A L DAVY

Thomas Arthur Lewis Davy (1900-1909), known as “Taddy”, became the next Rhodes Scholar in 1909 when he attended Exeter College to study law for four years.

Subsequently he was called to the Bar in England in 1913.

In 1915 he went to war. He rose to the rank of Captain in the Royal Field Artillery, serving in France and India until 1919.

Entering politics and the Western Australian Parliament in 1924, Taddy, during his career, served as Attorney General, Minister for Education and Deputy leader of the Nationalist party until 1933.
