



ALEXANDER PHIPPS TURNBULL

Three years later **Alexander Phipps Turnbull (1898-1907)** became the second Haleian to win the award.

Phipps graduated in 1907. Having been granted a First Class Honours degree from Merton College in 1910, he practiced law as a barrister and solicitor in Perth (1912-1914).

On the outbreak of the Great War, Alexander joined the 10th Australian Light Horse Regiment, rising to the rank of 2nd Lieutenant. He was killed in action at Gallipoli on the 7 August 1915, an action graphically depicted in the closing scenes of Peter Weir's film, "Gallipoli".
